

### **National:**

Mainstream resilience in national policies and legislation, including strengthening disaster risk reduction and climate resilience, including multi-hazard early warning systems

Enhance domestic resource mobilization and promote public-private partnerships

Reinforce the national capacities on debt management, including the participation in the Sustainable Debt Coalition

Strengthen Blue Economy Strategies and Carbon Credit regulations

Increase the gross expenditure on research and development (GERD) and STI



Strengthen regional institutions and mechanisms for cooperation, including the AISCC and IOC

Promote regional cooperation, harnessing regional initiatives, such as the Great Blue Wall Initiative and the Regional registry for carbon credits for African SIDS

Encourage collaboration among SIDS in the region to pool resources, share experiences, and jointly address common challenges

Support effective engagement and benefits from regional integration initiatives while considering the specificities of SIDS

Promote regional innovative financial mechanisms, such as the Regional Bonds for African SIDS

### Inter-Regional (among SIDS Regions: Caribbean, Pacific, AIS):

Strengthen the capacities of SIDS coordination mechanisms, including AOSIS

Develop the carbon markets in SIDS with focus on blue and green carbon, as a sustainable financial mechanism

Support research and development initiatives that focus on finding sustainable solutions tailored to the challenges faced by SIDS

Explore mechanisms for technology transfer and access to affordable and appropriate technologies for SIDS

Invest in education and training programs to develop a skilled workforce

Foster partnerships between SIDS, regional organizations, and stakeholders to share best practices, expertise, and lessons learned

Promote SIDS specific programmes and coordination mechanisms within UN Regional Economic Commissions and the broader UN Development System in SIDS

### International:

Strengthen sustainable financial mechanisms for SIDS including blended finance, and explore debt relief initiatives and financial restructuring options, such as debt-for-climate-investment swaps

Enhance SIDS technical and institutional capacities

Support research and development (R&D) and science, technology and innovation (STI) initiatives, as well as technology transfer and indigenous knowledge

Improve data systems and knowledge sharing

Promote partnerships with international organizations, research institutions, and private sector entities

Support the implementation of the SDGs Stimulus Package in SIDS


