



# <u>DRAFT</u> CONCEPT NOTE FOR STATISTICS SKILLS TRAINING FOR POLICYMAKERS FROM THE MINISTRY OF TRADE, INDUSTRY, REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND EMPLOYMENT (MOTIE), THE GAMBIA

#### 1. Introduction

There are growing consensuses among policymakers in the Ministry of Trade, Industry, Regional Integration and Employment (MOTIE) on the importance to utilize high-quality data to guide the planning, implementation and evaluation of polices and programmes supporting MSME growth in The Gambia. Increasingly, policymakers have realized that rigorous data analyses comprise crucial parts for strengthening evidence-based policymaking process. It is not only useful in the policy design stage, on the one hand, but also in the policy drafting stage on the other. Therefore, using robust data analysis can provide many insights to guide policymakers, with benefits such as smarter policies. Nevertheless, capacities of utilizing data analysis tools to inform policymaking process need to be strengthened among MOTIE policymakers. Therefore, to enhance the effectiveness and evidence-based formulation of MSME supporting policies in the Gambia, such as the National MSME Policy 2019-2024, MOTIE has requested the support of DESA for this statistics skill training, which will not only enhance application skills of policymaker on statistics analysis tools, such as E-view, but also to improve their knowledge on the value of data and enhance capacities of accessing, critically appraising, and incorporating data analysis to strengthen evidence-based policymaking process.

### 2. Objectives

- Strengthen capacities of policymakers in the application of data analysis methods in the design, implementation and evaluation of MSME supporting policies
- Enhance skills of policymakers on specific statistics analysis tools requested by MOTIE, including E-view and SPSS as well as their application in policy analysis process
- Improve the skills of policymakers in providing actionable insights based on statistical and economic significance of research results in order to inform future actions

Capacities of policymakers in MOTIE are strengthened to apply data analysis methods, such as Eview and SPSS in the design, implementation and evaluation of MSME supporting policies. Through the training policymakers are will be equipped with analytical skills contributing to evidence-based policymaking process
