## Session: Experiences from partnering during the COVID-19 pandemic

Multi-stakeholder collaborations are key mechanisms to tackle the challenges of COVID-19 and will be essential as societies look to build more sustainable, resilient, and inclusive societies. Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, the international community has made significant efforts to mobilize partnerships to accelerate the global response to COVID-19.

The session will feature speakers that can share their first-hand experience and lessons learned in building and managing partnerships during the pandemic and how these could be of use when tackling other urgent global challenges such as climate change.
