As civil society organizations we are deeply concerned with the forthcoming 2022 UN Ocean Conference as it is the platform where the real voice of the voiceless will be heard and amplified to the international policy makers therefore we would like to contribute to development of the Zero Draft 2022 United Nations Ocean Conference Political Declaration as follows

- 1. We argue for the world leaders to establish and adopt a unified Post COVID 19 pandemic collection and recycling of plastic waste products e.g. masks, gloves, Personal Protective Equipment gears, bottle sanitizers produced during the pandemic
- 2. Researchers must track Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) after entering the marine environment and understand their potential fate
