Format

- High-level sessions, thematic sessions and special events:
 - *Hybrid format*: in-person and virtual participation (<2 delegates per MS, 1 each for others)
 - Selected representatives make interventions and access video call directly. All others follow through webcast (<u>UN Web TV</u>)
 - Panelists prepare 5 min. videos before the Forum, interactive panel format during Forum
- All other informal sessions, roundtables and side events:
 - Fully virtual format. Exact formats and engagement possibilities depend on the session/event.
- All events integrated in Whova platform ("one-stop shop")
 - One registration to access them all (and also available on demand)
 - Online chat and structured discussions. Virtual booths and networking.
