UN 2023 Water Conference

"Our watershed moment: uniting the world for water"

- 2016: the UNGA proclaimed the period from 2018 to 2028 as the International Decade for Action, "Water for Sustainable Development"
- 2018: the UNGA decided to convene, in New York, from 22 to 24 March 2023, the United Nations Conference on the Midterm Comprehensive Review of the Implementation of the Objectives of the International Decade for Action
- 2020: the UNGA adopted Resolution 75/212 regarding the modalities for this Conference



UN 2023 Water Conference

- Date and venue: 22-24 March 2023, New York, UN Headquarters
- <u>Theme:</u> "Midterm Comprehensive Review of the Implementation of the Objectives of the International Decade for Action, "Water for Sustainable Development", 2018–2028"
- **Key objective:** Support to achieve the internationally agreed water-related goals and targets, including those contained in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
- **<u>Presidents of the Conference</u>**: Governments of Tajikistan and the Netherlands
- <u>Secretary-General of the Conference:</u> Mr. Liu Zhenmin, Under-Secretary-General for Economic and Social Affairs of the United Nations
- <u>Preparatory meeting:</u> a one-day preparatory meeting, by November 2022, New York, UN Headquarters, stakeholders are welcome as observers




"Our watershed moment: uniting the world for water"

The Netherlands and Tajikistan, as co-hosts, and UNDESA with the support of UN-Water as Secretariat of the Conference will strive to make the Conference <u>a watershed moment for the world.</u>

- Three Principles:
 - Inclusive: both in terms of (a) the Conference process (ensure vertical and horizontal inclusiveness) and in terms of (b) the results (leaving no-one behind).
 - **Cross-sectoral**: the Conference should mobilise all other sectors to improve the way they manage and utilize water resources. These sectors need to bring their plans and actions to the Conference.
 - Action-oriented: the Conference aims to lead to concrete results through concrete actions and plans on the ground.

Mina Guli – a leading water advocate, Eco activist, Australian runner – with the support of Tajikistan and the Netherlands plan to organize a one-year Global Water Marathon to attract more attention and promote stakeholder's engagement in the preparatory process and the Conference itself.

The marathon was start on World Water Day, March 22, 2022, and will end 1 year later at the opening of the UN Water Conference in 2023.

Main objectives:

- to run 200 marathons in the most extreme places on the planet in 12 months;
- to involve more than 200 million people;
- to get 200 companies to commit to taking individual action on water in the framework of the UN Water Conference.





Cooperation and Partnership



- Considering our challenges, we identified the need for, and strive to realize:
 - Scaled up finance and funding by governments, MDBs and private sector;
 - Scaled up and replicated actions and best practices;
 - Innovations to get the world on track;
 - Follow up UN conference on water to mark the results of the decade and the 2023 outcomes;
 - An agenda going beyond 2030;
 - Concluding in the roadmap and timeline to inspire, unite and guide the world



What will the Conference deliver?

The Conference will help set the agenda until 2030, and thereafter, in two ways:

- 1. Deliver a summary of the Conference proceedings
- 2. Present a set of voluntary commitments in a Water Action Agenda to get the world back on track:
 - Scale up and replicate what works
 - **Discontinue or change** what does not work
 - Innovate what needs to be improved
 - Fund what merits funding
- 3. Roadmap towards 2028 (Decade) and 2030 (SDGs)
- Commitments can come through coalitions and partnerships across all of society
