

OCEAN PROTECTION RESOLUTION APPROVED AT IUSY WORLD COUNCIL

Presidents of the UN Ocean Conference, Secretary-General of the UN Ocean Conference, Excellencies,

- 1 Our oceans are being destroyed for profit, damaging ancient ecosystems and diminishing
- 2 many species of fish.

- 3 This should be of major concern to humanity, as the ocean provides life to our planet; it
- 4 regulates our climate, provides 50% of the air we breathe, and stores an estimated 50 times
- 5 more carbon dioxide than the atmosphere. Put simply, if the ocean dies, so do we.
- 6 Certain practices are significantly more harmful than others, such as bottom trawling; a
- 7 destructive fishing technique where heavily weighted nets are dragged along the seafloor,
- 8 destroying entire ocean floor ecosystems as they go. Even decades later, areas which have
- 9 been trawled remain unrecovered and their destruction undermines the entire ocean
- 10 ecosystem. This practice is fast damaging our oceans beyond repair; rapidly diminishing
- 11 many aquatic species, and causing irreversible seabed damage.
- 12 Another devastating practice is seabed mining; which will be used to extract minerals and
- metals from sand on and below the ocean floor. It is still new and experimental, yet has
- already proven it will have numerous harmful effects to the ocean. Namely, creating powerful
- underwater noise pollution, destroying large areas of the seafloor, and expelling sediment
- plumes which will harm mid and deep sea inhabitants for kilometres. If seabed mining
- 17 commences, our oceans will experience devastating biodiversity loss. We need to take a
- 18 strong stance against eminently destructive practices such as this. These are just two of
- 19 countless ways we are putting our oceans at risk. By outlawing the most destructive
- 20 practices we take an important step towards saving our oceans.
