<u>UN 2023 Water Conference - Open Call for Side Events</u> <u>Deadline 13 January 2023</u>

Side events can be organized in connection with the UN 2023 Water Conference by Member States, the UN system, Intergovernmental Organizations and accredited non-governmental stakeholders. All interested parties are strongly encouraged to partner with others to organize a side event. Side events can be held either in-person inside UN Headquarters, in-person in other locations in New York, or virtually. The side events will be an opportunity for all participants to share knowledge and solutions to accelerate implementation of SDG 6 and showcase voluntary commitments for the Water Action Agenda. The deadline for the open call is 13 January 2023. Additional details and guidance on how to submit a side event proposal, including Guidelines, is available on the Side Events webpage.

37th UN-Water Meeting brings together its Members and Partners to collaborate on Concept Papers for the Interactive Dialogues of the UN 2023 Water Conference

UN-Water held an extensive consultation for its Members and Partners on the UN 2023 Water Conference Interactive Dialogue Concept Papers during the 37th UN-Water Meeting on 5-6 December at the UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, France. Input to the five Interactive Dialogues was collected through the World Café format which allowed for short, focused and inclusive discussions on each of the Dialogue themes (Water for Health; Water for Sustainable Development; Water for Climate, Resilience and Environment; Water for Cooperation; Water Action Decade). The inputs will inform the final production stage of the Concept Papers for the Interactive Dialogues of the UN 2023 Water Conference.

The <u>Water Action Agenda</u> was also discussed during the UN-Water Meeting, with participants brainstorming the role of each stakeholder in bringing commitments and the radical collaborations that are needed to turn those commitments into action. <u>UN-Water Groundwater summit sees commitments to collaboration on regional and global level</u>

The Summit (Paris, 7-8 December) gathered more than 850 on-site participants, 3,500 online participants and provided the framework for groundwater to be visible worldwide. More than 30 governments and organizations have decided to join forces to launch the Transboundary Water Cooperation Coalition and push for greater cross-border cooperation over increasingly limited water resources.



The "UN-Water Joint message and call for action on groundwater" was presented at the Summit, which calls upon governments, the donor community, the private sector, and civil society to submit voluntary commitments to the Water Action Agenda, one of the outcome of the UN 2023 Water Conference.

Regional preparatory meetings

UNECE

Key messages to the UN 2023 Water Conference were agreed by the <u>Sixth session of the Meeting of the Parties</u> to the Protocol on Water and Health (Geneva, 16-18 November 2022). The Meeting of the Parties endorsed **Key messages and actions needed to strengthen WASH resilience to climate change and future pandemics** to be submitted by its Chair (Hungary) to the United Nations 2023 Water Conference. The Meeting also encouraged countries to submit voluntary commitments and concrete actions on water and health at the United Nations 2023 Water Conference and to promote the Protocol in the preparatory process and at the Conference.

UN ESCWA

In collaboration with the Regional Commissions, ESCWA coordinated the <u>Regional Dialogues</u> sessions at the <u>UN-Water Summit on Groundwater</u> (Paris, 7-8 December). The session drew on the Water Action Decade Regional Preparatory Meetings for the UN 2023 Water Conference to inform dialogues on overcoming challenges and promoting sustainable solutions in groundwater management.

UN ECLAC

UN ECLAC has moved the Regional Water Dialogues from January to 1 – 3 February 2023 to accommodate more stakeholders and voices. The high level panels envisioned are: Water and Climate, Water and Sustainable Development, Water and Cooperation, and Water, Energy, Food and Environment and a full day of presenting solutions for Valuing Water and Accelerating the Achievement of SDG 6. As a result of the Regional Dialogues, ECLAC will elaborate and adopt a Regional Water Action Agenda.
