The UN 2023 Water Conference offers a once-in-a-generation opportunity to bring together Member States, the UN system and stakeholders across sectors to mobilize political leadership and address global water challenges in an inclusive and action-oriented environment. Water is inextricably linked to the three pillars of sustainable development. Halfway into the Water Action Decade, our progress on water related goals and targets remains alarmingly off track.

Water can be the dealmaker and leverage point for a green economy, climate resilience and a more sustainable and inclusive world.
