EARLY WARNINGS FOR ALL INITIATIVE

The Secretary-General launched the initiative to provide effective multi-hazard early warning systems to all within the next five years. The Executive Action Plan for the initiative calls for initial new targeted investments of \$3.1 billion between 2023 and 2027.

RESILIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY TRUST

In April 2022, the IMF's Executive Board approved the establishment of the Resilience and Sustainability Trust to help low-income and vulnerable middle-income countries build resilience to external shocks and ensure sustainable growth, contributing to their longer-term balance of payments stability.
