AUSTRIA: MINISTER NORBERT TOTSCHNIG - INTERAKTIV DIALOG 4, LEAD DISCUSSANT

Distinguished Co- Chairs, Excellencies, dear colleagues Ladies and Gentlemen,

- Thank you,
- I would **like to thank the Co-chairs Switzerland and Senegal** for leading this important Interactive Dialogue and for the excellent preparation in cooperation with the UN partners.
- Let me start by simply saying a three-letter word: Yes.
- Yes to cooperation, because I am fully convinced that crosssectoral cooperation <u>will help</u> solving the global water crisis.
- Yes, because it is essential that we work together horizontally across borders and vertically across sectors.
- Let me give you an example. Austria is a landlocked country with many fresh water sources, Alpine rivers and lakes – also across political borders.
- We have created a mutually beneficial environment by establishing transboundary institutions and frameworks of

cooperation and by bringing together specialists in the field of water supply and wastewater treatment.

- In close cooperation with the World Bank and the IAWD, the International Association of Water Service Companies in the Danube River Catchment Area, we have implemented the Danube Water Program 10 years ago.
- This close cooperation guarantees
 - smart policies, strong utilities and sustainable water and wastewater services in all partnering countries of the Danube region.
- Ladies and Gentlemen,
- There is no doubt: our number one priority remains to provide
 clean drinking water and adequate sanitation for all.
- At the same time, we are also looking into ways to optimize
 the indirect use of water, taking into account the water-foodenergy-ecosystem nexus.
- Water is indeed essential for food production and in my country, some 60% of our electricity is produced by hydropower.

- To facilitate a cross-sectoral dialogue we have established our own national platform a "platform for the future," as we call it in order to engage all stakeholders from various sectors.
- With regards to the water-food-energy-ecosystem nexus, the European Union Water Framework Directive provides clear regulations for resource protection while taking into account the demands of individual sectors.
- However, the water and sanitation crisis cannot be solved without the commitment of individuals.
- Each and every one of us has to make their own contribution.
- This is why Austria also invests into awareness raising campaigns for civil society.
- So let me come to an end and reiterate that water cooperation has to be cross-sectoral, on every level.
- It has to be action-oriented and inclusive. And it would thus be
 an important step to establish a Global Envoy on Water Issues
 to even better coordinate amongst UN member states and to
 give billions of people a voice.
- Finally, we have to include all parts of society, not least the younger generations. They are the Ambassadors of change and
