



Virtual Dialogue between the Independent Group of Scientists (IGS) for the 2023 Global Sustainable Development Report (GSDR) and representatives from local and regional governments

1st June 2023

Concept Note

A. BACKGROUND: GSDR & the 2023 SDG Summit

The <u>Global Sustainable Development Report (GSDR)</u> was first mandated in "<u>The Future We</u> <u>Want</u>", the outcome of <u>the 2012 Rio+20 Conference</u>, and further reaffirmed in <u>the 2030 Agenda</u> for <u>Sustainable Development</u>, with a view to strengthening the science-policy interface and providing a strong evidence-based instrument to support policy-makers to better understand and navigate the relationships among social, environmental and economic development objectives. In 2016 Member States <u>decided</u> that the GSDR will be produced once every four years to inform the quadrennial High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development under the auspices of the General Assembly (the SDG Summit) and that it should be written by an Independent Group of Scientists (IGS) appointed by the Secretary-General. The IGS consists of 15 experts representing a variety of backgrounds, scientific disciplines, and institutions, ensuring geographical and gender balance.

2023 will mark the mid-point of the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The 2023 SDG Summit will be held in September 2023, during the high-level week of the 78th session of the General Assembly. It will review the state of the SDG implementation, provide policy guidance, mobilize action to accelerate implementation and consider new challenges since 2015. The upcoming 2023 GSDR will be an important instrument to inform the deliberations at the Summit. An initial draft of the 2023 GSDR has been circulated to governments and the major groups and other stakeholders in January 2023 for comments. An advanced copy of the 2023 GSDR was made available in March to inform the intergovernmental deliberations on the political declaration to be adopted at the 2023 SDG Summit in September.

B. The proposal: a virtual dialogue between the IGS and local and regional governments

The virtual dialogue will provide an opportunity for a United Nations officer supporting the report and a member of the IGS to share key messages from the GSDR with representatives from local and regional governments and to engage in a dialogue about specific ways that the GSDR recommendations could be nurtured by the perspective of local and regional governments and how they can be implemented at sub-national level. Local and regional governments representatives will also be invited to share examples of scalable, practical tools that can support in accelerating SDG implementation considering the main recommendations of the report as well as to reflect on how local and regional governments and local communities can be supported to lead in efforts for transformation in the various entry points identified in the report.

- 1. Based on the presentation, have the local and regional governments roles and perceived priorities, challenges and opportunities for SDG achievement been addressed by the report?
- 2. What are some examples of scalable, practical tools implemented at sub-national level that could contribute to implementing the recommendations of the Report?
- 3. Are there any additional concrete policy recommendations the report should incorporate to support local and regional governments to more effectively contribute to the SDGs going forward?
