Ladies and Gentlemen,

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Ethiopia's economy is mainly based on the agriculture sector, which plays an important role in the national economy, accounting for 35% of the national Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and the livelihood of its people. The sector is also the leading foreign exchange earner and drives aggregate employment for more than 72% of the population.

We know all too well that there is no country in history which has managed to transform its economy without creating a strong manufacturing sector, since growth in the manufacturing sector is fast and much higher than other sectors & its contribution; such as to poverty reduction through employment & income generation is immense, have positive correlation with economic growth and job creation, extensive linkage to the other sectors particularly with agriculture & service sector and proven tool for technological advancement

In general, manufacturing is an engine of structural transformation.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Small and medium manufacturing industries are the bases of large industries and have significant role for industrialization. As long as appropriate policies, strategies and incentives formulated and provided for SMEs, the manufacturing sector will achieve sustainable growth and development.

Thus, small and medium enterprises (SMEs) have a key role in economic growth and equitable development in developing countries. Their contribution to employment generation, poverty reduction and wider distribution of wealth and opportunities represents a major window of opportunity for most developing countries. However, the potential role of SMEs is often not realized because of a set of problems commonly related to size.

The Ministry of Industry (MOI) and Ethiopian Enterprise Development have been formulated different programs and strategies and delivered business development services and capacity building programmes to expand MSME (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) resilience towards uncertainties and elevate their contributions to SDGs, especially in the area of decent job creation. Currently over 24 000 (twenty four thousand) small and medium manufacturing enterprises exist and play an important role in job creation and import substitution.

Despite the huge contributions made the MSME sector, they face various challenges such as low productivity and competitiveness due to: -

- Use of antiquated technologies and aging equipment
- High costs of utilities and interrupted supplies
- High costs of doing business
- Limited access and high cost of finance
- Weak managerial, technical and entrepreneurial capacities
- Inadequate supply of basic infrastructures are the major constraints that SMEs have been faced.

Therefore, the government together with other support institutions has put in place various measures to support and create conducive environment for SMEs and to expand regional industrialization throughout the country the government doing various programs and projects with different government institutions' and development partners. However, more support is required to meet the huge demands of the MSMEs given the magnitude of the challenges.

In general the development of manufacturing industries presents Ethiopia with the opportunity to accelerate economic development and achieve its industrial development goals. In line with this we are currently implementing a flagship national program called "**Ethiopia Tamirt**". Since we started this movement we were able to reestablish and open more than 300 enterprises which were closed due to various problems. We were able to bring the sector in to high attention and focus area of the respective stake holders and bring industrialization to be the prior agenda of the country.

This project supported by UNDESA have come at the right time as they are aimed at enhancing national capacities to strengthen the resilience of MSMEs(Micro Small and Medium Enterprises) as well as strengthening the enterprises themselves to accelerate the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Thus, the objective of this project is lined up with the ministry of industry policy and strategies especially on the intervention of SME support. I am pleased to note that the project has commenced with the achievement of one of the milestones, the development of MSME capacity building Framework.

Therefore, the Ministry has high expectations on the delivery of this assignment which will enable the availing of appropriate information for the development of the sector. Let me once again take this opportunity to thank the Division for Sustainable Development Goals under UNDESA for the support.
