EDUCATION FOR GREEN JOBS

HESI ACTION GROUP: RATINGS, RANKINGS & ASSESSMENTS

- Higher Education has a significant role to play in addressing the SDGs.
 - With more than 35,000 HEIs globally, their potential for impact is significant – thus support and encouragement of their progress are critical to achievement of the SDGs.
- Although there is no single organization with oversight of HEIs, there are a number of ranking, rating and assessment organizations that assess HEI performance.
- By encouraging these organizations to focus on the appropriate measures of sustainability we can help to change the sector.
- This is one of the levers that can be used (although there are others).



RATINGS, RANKINGS & ASSESSMENTS

- No one can afford not knowing nor acting about sustainability NOW
- How to increase the sustainability literacy of all current and future decisions makers?
- How to build the common language that enable individuals to collaborate and act for a sustainable future?
- How to equip higher education institutions and organizations with relevant tools and data to pilot and demonstrate their impact on sustainability literacy?

- Drive progress towards the SDGs
- Provide practical tools and actionable guidance that publishers, editors, researchers and practitioners can use to prioritize SDGs in the research agenda and in educational materials while improving connections between practice and research



SDG PUBLISHERS COMPACT

THE UNITED NATIONS ACADEMIC IMPACT (UNAI)

- The United Nations Academic Impact (UNAI) is an initiative that engages institutions of higher education with the United Nations in supporting and contributing to the realization of the Organization's purposes and principles, including the SDGs
 - 1,600 member institutions
 - 150 countries
- Voluntary University Reviews (VURs) could form an important connection
- The responsibility of UNAI member institutions is to actively support at least one of the Sustainable Development Goals or the 10 UNAI principles. This support will enable a sharing of experiences and best practices as well as the infusion of scholarship to advance social, economic and sustainability objectives.





- Knowledge gap on integrating SDGs into higher ed globally
- Connect higher education institutions, networks & student organizations to facilitate transfer of knowledge
- Focus on curricula; research and development; campus practices



HESI PARTNER PROGRAMME

HESI ACTION GROUP: EDUCATION FOR GREEN JOBS

This year:

- Expanded the virtual community: ~ 4000 participants from over 100 countries
- Created seven Solutions Summits
- Compiled and shared resources
- Developed a toolkit highlighting opportunities and good practices
- Supported the creation of cross sector stakeholder alliances
- Connecting cities, students, and experts, with a special emphasis on the global south
- Empowered youth to be change agents

Future plans:

- Increase collaboration within and across countries for better workforce development, placements, inclusion and retention
- Deepen the efforts within the virtual community to fill in the gaps in existing efforts
- Empower and support key system shifts to accelerate workforce development and meet the needs for an inclusive transition to sustainable societies



EDUCATION FOR GREEN JOBS

HESI ACTION GROUP: RATINGS, RANKINGS AND ASSESSMENTS

This year:

- Working with the joint task force on outcomes to understand how measurement of activities across all aspects of sustainability can move from measuring inputs towards measuring differential outcomes.
- Gathering data on existing initiatives in the rankings and ratings space
- This year has also seen the review of several methodologies, and an extension of the number of HEIs providing data to sustainability measurements.

Future plans:

- Encourage accreditation agencies to adopt sustainability as part of their requirements
- Work with the bibliometrics suppliers to explore ways of evaluating the SDGs
- Continue to evaluate existing rankings and ratings by refreshing the survey

This year:

- Presented Top Action Tips at 8 targeted training and engagement events, including

 - DORA@10 Workshop on Plain Language Summaries tinyurl.com/PlainLanguageSummaries
- Developed the SDG Rubric for Textbooks: sdgcompactfellows.org/s/SDG-Textbook-Rubric.pdf
- Created cross stakeholder alliances

Learned:

- We can all make a difference, and often small changes can have a big effect (such as implementing our Top Tips!)
- There is lots of support for the SDGs but incentives structures don't always align with the SDGs - a role for academics, funders, policymakers

Future plans:

- Increase number of members of SDG Publishers Compact-<u>un.org/sustainabledevelopment/sdg-</u> <u>publishers-compact/</u>
- Grow the community connected to the SDG Compact Fellows - contact us via the website
- Host three more summits
- Motivate more stakeholders to publish and implement Top Action Tips
- Publish more SDG related content, make it easy to find, and accessible
- Publish on emphasizing research outcomes instead of citation outputs
- Leverage AI to improve SDG content useability and accessibility

UNITED NATIONS ACADEMIC IMPACT (UNAI)

UNAI SDGs workshops & trainings

 UNAI hosts a series of workshops and trainings to build capacity for universities and colleges, emphasizing the contributions of academia in advancing the SDGs and fostering the involvement of these institutions. This year, UNAI has led 20+ trainings.

SDG Toolkit, partnerships & conferences:

 UNAI partners with aggregators of research to create informational SDGs toolkits; to provide platforms of discussion for sideevents, including this year's 67th Session of the Commission on the Status of Women and UN Water Conference; and to engage at conferences in learning and sharing best practices.

Voluntary University Reviews:

 UNAI is guiding member institutions in the formation of a standardized method for delivering Voluntary University Reviews, intended for institutions to track their own progress as well as increase the UN's analytical capacity in implementing the 2030 Agenda.
