SIDS among are the most vulnerable countries to external shocks. They are facing an of unprecedented set events, stemming partly from i) the COVID-19 pandemic which has exacerbated their debt situation ii) rising cost of living due in part to the situation between Russia and Ukraine and (iii) climate-related disasters.

Pacific SIDS are experiencing fiscal and financial stress from the impacts of COVID-19 pandemic, as a result of increased public spending to respond to the health emergency and to recover from its impacts. National revenues from key economic sectors such as tourism have been slow to fully recover. At the same time, climate change and weather related disasters continues to threaten achievement of sustainable development, destroying biodiversity, infrastructure and interfering with livelihoods

Unaddressed, there will deepening hardship, debt defaults, widening and inequality, Overcoming these challenges requires the rapid scaling up of investments and available financial resources as well as capacity building to reduce vulnerability and build resilience. This session will focus on challenges and emerging issues deserving closer attention to enhance the resilience to external shocks in Pacific SIDS and explore way forward.

This session focuses on scaling up innovative approaches ensuring the sustainable development of pacific SIDS.
