Unlocking the Next Generation of Changemakers

On September 16, the United Nations Foundation hosted *Unlocking the Next Generation of Changemakers*, a high-level, intergenerational event at the 2023 SDG Summit. The event brought together major youth-led and youth-focused organizations, international organizations, champion Member States, and private sector, and other partners to accelerate SDG delivery and lay the groundwork for the Summit of the Future.

The event was supported by partners of the <u>Unlock the Future</u> coalition, leaders of the largest youth organizations reaching almost one billion people globally. The coalition harnessed this opportunity for long-term, high-impact investments in next and future generations and to launch the <u>Unlock the Future</u> <u>Declaration II</u> and <u>The Road to 2100</u>.
