## General Statement by the Republic of Latvia

climate crisis and its consequences is important.

Since the adoption of SAMOA Pathway in 2014, the world has and continues to experience significant transformations especially digital. Digital skills, equal opportunities and data gathering and analysis are essential for sustainable development. Therefore, we welcome the proposal to establish a SIDS Centre of Excellence in Antigua and Barbuda which will also include SIDS Data Hub and we are open to discuss how we can contribute to it with our national expertise and share our own experience in digitalization and promoting digital skills.

In conclusion, Dear Co-chairs, I once again reiterate Latvia's commitment to contribute to this process as the Rapporteur of the Preparatory Committee and as a friend of SIDS. I thank you!
