United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) statement at the First Preparatory Committee for the 4th International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS 4)

22 January 2024

Excellencies,
Distinguished delegates,
Ladies and gentlemen,

- We know that SIDS are among the most vulnerable countries in the world.
- UNIDO is committed to playing its part in helping SIDS to build **resilient** economies.
- We support SIDS in enhancing their local productive capacities and diversifying their economies in an environment-friendly manner.
- This is essential for SIDS to reduce vulnerability to shocks in the context of the climate change and other crises.
- To achieve this, UNIDO has a dedicated **SIDS strategy**, which builds on the SAMOA pathway and will be further aligned with the outcomes of SIDS 4.
- Our focus is on a **two-pronged approach**.
 - On the one hand, we promote sustainable energy to reduce the dependence of local industries on fuel imports.
 - On the other hand, we support the integration of SIDS into global value chains, through trade capacity-building, investment promotion and blue economy initiatives.
- Allow me to mention three examples of how we implement this in practice:
 - One is the Global Network of Regional Sustainable Energy Centers, jointly managed by UNIDO and SIDS regional economic communities.

- Another example is the Global Ocean Energy Alliance, launched by UNIDO and SIDS DOCK at the 2022 UN Oceans Conference.
- A third example is the 'ACP Business Friendly' programme, in which UNIDO, the World Bank and ITC support the integration of SIDS into value chains through inclusive policies and investment promotion.

Ladies and gentlemen,

- Allow me to conclude by reiterating that SIDS are important constituents of UNIDO.
- We will continue to work closely with our partners to address their challenges through practical solutions.
- And we look forward to engaging with all of you in the lead up to SIDS 4 and beyond.
