International Science Council Statements

- Collaboration must be fostered among SIDS within different regions to utilise science beyond digitalization more effectively.
- SIDS face challenges in logistical, financial, and tax support despite offering solutions to environmental and public health issues.
- SIDS need to ensure SIDS scientists articulate a research agenda which is relevant to SIDS rather than it being defined by Global North institutions.
- SIDS need effective mechanisms to enhance cooperation between academia, the private sector, and civil society. Synergy among such stakeholders could lead to increased selfsufficiency and help with climate change adaptation and mitigation.
- SIDS need to leverage their geographical advantages to attract investments in Research and Development and Technology.
- SIDS need to capitalise on their favourable environments and quality-of-life to attract talent into innovation ecosystems.
