Good afternoon

Thank you, your excellencies, President of ECOSOC, Co Facilitators of STI Forum.

As the Co-Chair of the Scientific and Technological Community Major Group (STC MG) thank you for the opportunity to provide our thoughts on the upcoming STI Forum. The STC MG co-led by the International Science Council (ISC) and the World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO), brings together more than 250 national science academies and international scientific organisations across the natural and social sciences, as well as more than 100 national engineering institutions representing more than 30 million engineers worldwide.

The STI Forum is our primary platform, and as every year, we stand ready to mobilize the expertise, knowledge, and resources that our community possesses to advance the complex issues on the multilateral agenda and under discussion at the STI Forum. The STC MG, with the support of H.E. Lachezara Stoeva, President of ECOSOC, and Co-Facilitators Amb. Mathu Joyini and Amb. Thomas Woodroffe, took significant strides last year. We organized a special event as part of the Forum, chaired a session during the Africa Day event and organized the Global Solutions Summit on the last day.
