# Partnership building and multi-stakeholder engagement for the 2030 Agenda

### Background

In the era of SDG implementation, we are all partners and beneficiaries. Transformational partnerships require multiple actors to bring together essential complementary resources, especially knowledge and data sharing. When combined, these resources create the levers required to transform systems from an unsustainable, undesired state to a more sustainable state that continues to provide benefits without continuous external inputs.

Achieving system transformation through multi-stakeholder partnerships requires a deep understanding of the intricacies involved in aligning diverse interests towards common, ambitious goals. The complexity of these partnerships often lies in effectively pooling resources, capabilities, and perspectives that no single entity could marshal on its own.

#### **Challenge and objective**

The primary challenge this session addresses is the formation of system-transformative partnerships that leverage the strengths and resources of various stakeholders to achieve outcomes that individual efforts cannot reach.

This session will guide participants through the stages of developing such partnerships, emphasizing the alignment of interests, broad and deep stakeholder engagement, defining a shared vision, identifying incentives, and establishing win-win scenarios. The goal is to equip participants with the understanding, frameworks, and tools necessary to initiate and sustain partnerships capable of driving system-wide transformation.

### Solutions

The session will introduce a range of tools, solutions, examples, and guidance materials related to partnership building and stakeholder engagement.

### Format and audience

This interactive virtual session will last two hours and will include presentations, and a case studie. Participants will engage in breakout sessions for hands-on experience in developing a partnership. The intended audience comprises stakeholders from various sectors who are actively involved in or are seeking to initiate large-scale transformational projects, such as government officials, business leaders, and representatives from non-profits and civil society. These participants are expected to bring a basic understanding of SDG-related challenges and a commitment to collaborative, impactful action.
