# What is the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development?

- A comprehensive plan outlining how we can end poverty and transform the world into a peaceful, sustainable environment for all
- Developed over the course of several years, with extensive consultations with Member States and stakeholders around the world
- In 2015, unanimously adopted by all UN member states.

"On behalf of the peoples we serve, we have adopted a historic decision on a comprehensive, far-reaching and peoplecentered set of universal and transformative goals and targets. We commit ourselves to working tirelessly for the full implementation of this agenda by 2030."

## The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

#### The 2030 Agenda includes:

- A **Declaration**, in which Member States set out their vision, shared principles and commitments, and a call for action to change our world
- 17 Sustainable Development
   Goals and 169 accompanying targets
- Provisions for follow up and review at global, regional and national levels
- Means of implementation and global partnership

#### Member States:


- "...all member states to develop as soon as practicable, ambitious national responses to the overall implementation of this Agenda. These can...build on existing planning instruments, such as national development and sustainable development strategies, as appropriate."
- Regional and Local Authorities
- Sub-regional institutions
- International institutions
- Academia
- Philanthropic organizations
- Volunteer groups and others

- Local and regional governments play a very important role in the achievement of the SDGs.
- As the level of government closest to local communities, they best understand local people's needs and priorities.
- It is estimated that 65% of the targets under the SDGs are linked to the mandates and work of local governments.

### THE AGENDA 2030 AND VOLUNTARY REVIEWS

The 2030 Agenda creates a system for regular monitoring and review of progress made





"We commit to fully engage in regular and inclusive reviews of progress at subnational, national, regional and global levels" (2030 Agenda, para. 77).



# What are the Voluntary Local Reviews?

- A method for monitoring the implementation of the SDGs carried out by local, municipal and regional governments or their associations.
- Voluntary Local Reviews are similar to Voluntary National Reviews. Both are essential tools to implement the SDGs and monitor progress

# The VNRs and the VLRs

# Voluntary National Reviews (VNR)

- Driven by national governments
- Has an official basis in the 2030
   Agenda
- To date, 191 countries have presented at least one VNR
- Presented annually at the High-level
   Political Forum

### **Voluntary Local Reviews (VLR)**

- Driven by local and regional governments and their associations
- Unofficial
- To date, local and regional governments and their associations have produced more than 300 VLRs
- Presented in various unofficial formats

The VLRs can inform the VNRs and viceversa. One important Benefit of carrying out the two process Together is that they can strengthen multilevel governance and thus improve the cohesion of policies and programmes.

## Objective of the workshop
