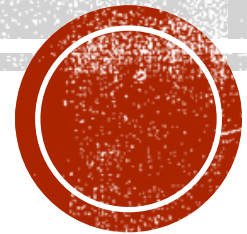

MANDATE OF DEPARTMENT OF GENDER AND FAMILY ISSUES

- **MAINSTREAM GENDER INTO AREAS OF DEVELOPMENT**
- **KEY RESPONSIBILITY – COORDINATION OF GENDER STAKEHOLDERS**
- **STAKEHOLDERS INCLUDE : GOVERNMENT MINISTRIES, CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS, FAITH BASED ORGANIZATIONS, TRADITIONAL SECTOR ETC**



- **HOW DO WE IDENTIFY THOSE WHO ARE BEING LEFT BEHIND, OR WHO ARE AT RISK OF BEING LEFT BEHIND?**

- **AT RISK : WOMEN AND GIRLS**

VULNERABLE GROUPS : MIGRANTS, REFUGEES , PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, ELDERLY PERSONS, WIDOWS, CHILDREN,

- **IDENTIFICATION**

- International & regional networking with like-minded organizations to gain context-relevant knowledge;
- Utilizing existing legislative structures to advocate for mainstreaming or integration
- Establishing national institutions to monitor and advocate for their rights.
- Adopting strong advocacy approaches: use of media, public awareness raising campaigns, use of communication



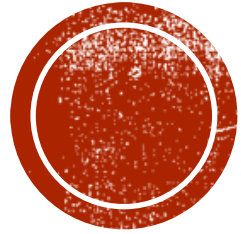
HOW CAN THE VLRS HELP ENSURE THAT NO ONE IS LEFT BEHIND?

- Conducting targeted consultative sessions
- Use their networks to ensure full participation
- Sensitization of the VLRS process for full understanding and ownership

What approaches to designing inclusive processes to ensure no one is left behind are available?

- Stakeholder mappings
- Coordination mechanisms – GBV, GEWE
- Networks e.g.: consortiums – Gender , children consortiums, portfolio committees (parliament)
- DATA STAKEHOLDERS: stakeholders themselves based on the surveys and audits carried out
