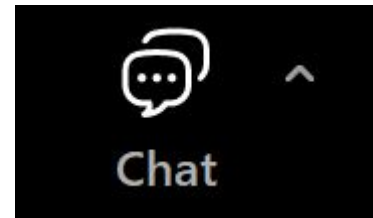

 **Limited Resources**
Constrained financial and human resources

 **Overconfident**
Stakeholders are often overly confident in their implementation capabilities

 **Complex Coordination**

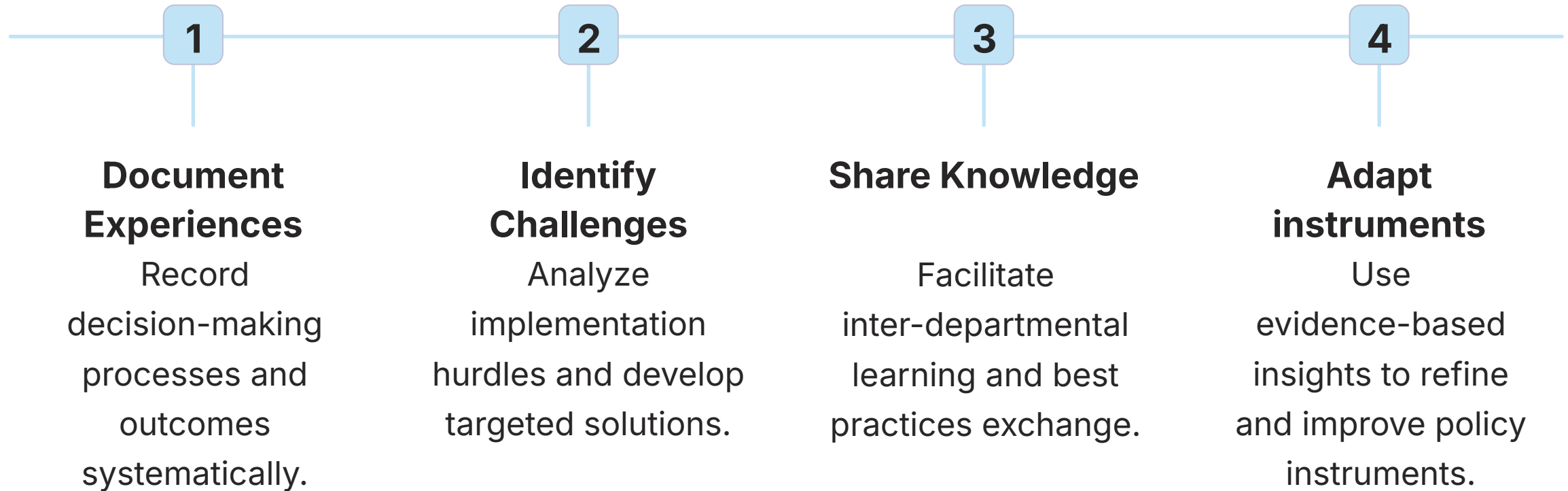

Key takeaways

1

Success requires

implementable processes, management quality, monitoring & evaluation, and learning systems must work together cohesively

2

Match delivery channels to objectives

Identify the most appropriate delivery channel and who will deliver it

3

Build implementation capacity

Ensure adequate skills and competencies are in place before launching policy instruments

4

Secure sustainable funding

Start with fully-funded pilots to demonstrate impact and build credibility before scaling up operations

5

Embed M&E from day one

Develop clear evaluation frameworks and guidelines before implementation begins

6

Create feedback loops

Systematically collect and analyse insights to continuously improve and redesign policy instruments
