- Micro-, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs)
 - 90% enterprises
 - 70% cent employment
 - Engines for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- MSMEs are hit hardest by the Covid-19 pandemic, interrupted supply chains, rising inflations
- Supporting MSMEs included in the Global Digital Compact endorsed by the Summit of the Future in this September
- MSMEs included in Secretary-General's report on Our Common Agenda, as a critical means to build a fair and resilient global economy for all
- Support MSMEs is to create jobs, inspire innovations, and accelerate sustainable development




