By aligning with global standards like the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights and SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) and international forums such as the ECOSOC Partnership forum, this event will demonstrate the critical role of regulatory adaptations and partnerships in enhancing the effectiveness of social finance mechanisms. 
