Background on the event

Public and private sector leaders gathered at the ECOSOC 2025 Partnership Forum side event, "Public-Private Inclusive and Sustainable Knowledge Partnerships," to explore how SDG knowledge can be transformed into a global public good. The event showcased six innovative projects that support sustainable, inclusive, and equitable access to knowledge through collaboration between governments, businesses, and academia.

Key Issues discussed

- Open and equitable access to knowledge is key: Open licensed educational content on the SDGs
 is a powerful tool to train educators, shape policies and ensure equitable access to knowledge, but
 it requires sustainable open educational resources models that takes into consideration technology
 advancements, and strengthening international cooperation.
- Promoting more inclusive and equitable global value chains: National industrial policies are
 still fragmented and there is a major gap in building capacities for a greener and more inclusive
 transition for businesses. There must be a space where governments, business, and communities
 can find more cohesive and inclusive learning on the skills needed for the future, and cooperate
 towards a cohesive industrial policy.
- **Private sector's role in achieving the SDGs:** Successful partnerships for the SDGs also include the private sector, especially the insurance sector, which directly impacts many goals and targets by providing a financial safety net and supporting growth and innovation.
- **Upskilling workers:** Achieving the green and digital transition requires the workforce is prepared and upskilled. However, many sectors are still falling behind, such as the construction sector, and vocational educational centers are not updating their curriculum fast enough.

- Higher education for inclusive and sustainable knowledge: There must be options for students
 and workers to upskill and embed sustainability into their careers through more flexible and
 inclusive learning pathways.
- Transforming attitudes about environmentalism: Many citizens still do not understand what it
 means to go green. Education and community engagement hold a great importance in teaching how
 to include sustainable practices in day to day actions

Key recommendations for action

- Support the <u>Dubai Declaration on Open Educational Resources (OER)</u>: The Declaration aims to help the implementation of the <u>2019 UNESCO OER Recommendation</u> UN's only instrument dedicated to openly licensed educational content in light of the digital technologies advancements that are reshaping how content is created and shared. This declaration sets up five key areas to implement and promote openly licensed educational content on the SDGs that are truly open, high-quality, and equitable for learners everywhere.
- Join and support the <u>Capabilities 4 the Future Hub</u>: This initiative seeks to bridge skill gaps and ensure global value chains are more inclusive by bringing together different stakeholders to align strategies, share expertise and coordinate efforts to ensure small businesses and less resourced economies are not left behind.
- Learn how the insurance sector is impacting and driving the SDGs: In an innovative approach, the soon-to-be-launched MOOC on Insurance and the SDGs, aims to showcase the impact of insurance in achieving the SDGs through case studies and real-world examples.
- Support the update of VET programs and curriculum: VET centers need to adapt their programs to the skills needed for the green and digital transition. One key project that is addressing this issue through a multi stakeholder approach is the BuildSkills Academy.
- **Support flexible and inclusive learning:** Expand access to online education programs that enable professionals to integrate sustainability into their careers. The SDG Academy currently partners with Sunway University in Malaysia, and University College Dublin in Ireland, to deliver <u>online</u> master's programs focused on sustainable development.
- **Encourage individuals to take action:** Campaigns like the <u>Green Pledge</u> by the <u>Green Institute</u> aims to encourage people and organizations to adopt simple, impactful eco-friendly habits, which can deliver a big impact in the environment.
