

Follow the Global Guiding elements for the VLR's from inception – prevents duplicated work and ensures all required detail is included.



Challenges	Solutions
Funding	Applying for grants and working within existing budgets. Capitalise on partnerships.
Conflicting priorities in diaries – non- attendance at sessions	* Support from Political leadership * Sharing information at existing forums
Lack of data for reporting	Stakeholder engagement and ongoing search for data. Will also be approaching academia. More collaboration for data collection is required.
Data is not relevant to the local context	Statistics bodies and data producers need to disaggregate data

Challenges	Solutions
Poor alignment amongst the 3 spheres of government	The three spheres of government need to work together, both for data collection and project implementation to ensure maximum impacts. This challenge is being dealt with in the current VLR process to ensure municipal data is included in the VNR.
Lack of data on SDG expenditure	Explore the use of the Municipal Standard Chart of Accounts to track spending on SDG implementation.
Still limited awareness about the SDGs, which may restrict the level of engagement will we receive from stakeholders	Awareness campaigns and information sharing sessions.






