2.

We need a comprehensive and participatory preparatory process.

Yes, member states are in the lead,

but we need all relevant stakeholders on board

from the UN system to civil society.

All these relevant voices need to be heard.

3.

We should build on the existing momentum,

and on the themes of the Water Conference 2023.

This includes a strong focus on critical topics

such as

the human rights to safe drinking water and sanitation,

agriculture and global food security

or

transboundary and international water cooperation.

4.

Already today we must look beyond the 2026 conference to be impactful.

What we need is focused, joint action and ambitious steps on water.

To reach this common objective,

a continued intergovernmental process is required.

Co-Chairs,

Together we have called for the 2026 Water Conference to deal,

for the first time,

with all aspects of SDG 6.

This conference has the potential

to drive global cooperation

and

to accelerate critically needed progress on water.

We believe this is an opportunity not to be missed.

I want to reiterate our full support for your important work.
