I would like to begin by expressing our sincere appreciation to Senegal and the UAE, the co-hosts of the UN 2026 Water Conference, for organizing this important session.

As we move closer to 2030, the global water situation remains alarming. The world is far behind in meeting its commitments under SDG 6:

Indeed, technological advancements offer unprecedented opportunities to enhance water efficiency, improve service delivery, and build resilience against climate-induced water risks.

We firmly believe that the momentum must continue beyond 2026. Tajikistan is honored to host the UN 2028 Water Conference, which will provide a dedicated opportunity to assess progress, enhance implementation mechanisms, and reinforce global partnerships.

To conclude, Tajikistan remains fully committed to working with you, the UN system, and all stakeholders to ensure that water stays at the heart of sustainable development and that we have a smooth transition from 2023 to 2026, building momentum toward 2028 and beyond.
