

Inaugural HESI Networking Forum Launches New Chapter in Higher Education for Sustainable Development

Virtual | 21 May 2025 — The Higher Education Sustainability Initiative (HESI) marked a major milestone with the successful launch of its first-ever Networking Forum, drawing more than 140 participants from across the globe. Held virtually on 21 May 2025, the event featured **68 interactive breakout rooms** and provided an inclusive space for dialogue, peer exchange, and partnership-building among universities, student groups, UN agencies, and networks.

The Forum marked the launch of the first activity under the new HESI Partnership Framework, which will be officially introduced at the upcoming 2025 HESI Global Forum on 21 July 2025. The Framework lays out a coordinated vision for how higher education can drive progress across the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Opening Remarks

The Forum opened with welcoming remarks from Mr. Ola Goransson (UN DESA), co-chair of HESI. He acknowledged HESI's broad community, which includes over 1,250 members across all regions and several UN partners, such as UNESCO, UNEP, UN Global Compact PRME, UN-HABITAT, UNCTAD, UNITAR, the UN Office for Partnerships, and UN Academic Impact.

Mr. Goransson encouraged participants to use the Forum to build relationships, explore synergies, and lay the groundwork for future collaboration.

In his overview of HESI, Mr. Goransson shared that HESI was launched in 2012 ahead of Rio+20 and has since grown into a global platform that supports multi-stakeholder dialogue, knowledge-sharing, and best practices in higher education for sustainable development. He introduced the five current HESI Action Groups and reflected on HESI's rich history of organizing forums and webinars, including the annual HESI Global Forum held as special event to the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF).

Mr. Francesc Pedro, Director of UNESCO IESALC, followed with remarks highlighting the central importance of collaboration, inclusivity, and knowledge co-creation in advancing the sustainable development agenda through higher education. He welcomed participants to this first-ever HESI Networking Forum and emphasized its value as a space for connection and mutual learning among a diverse and growing community.

Mr. Pedro noted that:

- Higher education institutions must act not only as knowledge producers but also as enablers of social transformation, equipping learners with the competencies, critical thinking, and agency to contribute meaningfully to sustainable development.
- The HESI Networking Forum aligns with UNESCO IESALC's commitment to inclusive and equitable higher education, and its efforts to reduce global inequalities in access to education, research funding, and scientific cooperation.
- Events like the Networking Forum are critical to empowering underrepresented voices, facilitating South-South and cross-regional dialogue, and ensuring that the sustainable development agenda is driven by diverse perspectives and lived experiences.

Mr. Pedro encouraged participants to see themselves as part of a shared movement within the HESI community—one that fosters collaboration across sectors and geographies, and works collectively toward a more just, inclusive, and sustainable world.

Interactive Format: Connecting the Global HESI Community

To foster connection and collaboration, participants then took part in three rounds of small-group networking breakout sessions, guided by structured prompts about their roles, sustainability priorities, and partnerships. This dynamic format sparked meaningful conversations and helped strengthen cross-regional ties across the HESI community.

Framing the Future: HESI Partnership Framework

The Forum concluded with a presentation of the HESI Partnership Framework by Mr. Ola Goransson (UN DESA), outlining a new roadmap for advancing structured engagement and collective action across the HESI community. He emphasized that the Framework is designed to guide and coordinate contributions from across HESI's network—including UN partners, student organizations, university networks, and higher education institutions—with the goal of enhancing academia's role in supporting the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and ensuring HESI is well structured and equipped to contribute to future post-2030 sustainable development discussions.

The Framework is organized around four core objectives:

- Gather Insights on priorities, gaps, and opportunities for transformative action in higher education.
- Highlight Innovations in teaching, research, and community engagement.
- Strengthen Partnerships across academia, government, civil society, and the private sector.
- Inform Policy with actionable recommendations and good practices.

These objectives are anchored in three focus areas where higher education institutions can drive sustainable development:

- Teaching and Learning Integrating sustainability into curricula and pedagogy.
- Research and Innovation Supporting evidence-based policy and science-informed solutions.
- Partnerships and Engagement Fostering collaboration for community impact and systems change.

The Framework also outlines a set of core activities to operationalize engagement, including:

- The annual HESI Global Forum.
- The new HESI Networking Forum, launched with this inaugural event.
- A series of Thematic Workshops, organized as Communities of Practice.
- And active support for engagement in key UN processes such as the HLPF and the UN Environment Assembly (UNEA).

Closing

Ms. Jonghwi Park (UN University) closed the Forum by highlighting the upcoming 2025 HESI Global Forum and inviting participants to continue their engagement in HESI's growing network and collective efforts. The 2025 HESI Global Forum will be held virtually on 21 July 2025, from 07:00 to 09:30 AM (EST), as an official special event of the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF). Held under the theme "Breaking Barriers in Sustainable Development Through Scientific, Inclusive, and Equitable Solutions," the Forum will explore how higher education can catalyze transformative action on the SDGs under review in 2025—including SDG 3 (Health), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 8 (Decent Work), SDG 14 (Life Below Water), and SDG 17 (Partnerships).

The Global Forum will bring together academia, policymakers, students, private sector leaders, and international organizations to:

- Promote interdisciplinary, science-based solutions to sustainable development challenges.
- Showcase strategies to make education systems more inclusive, equitable, and responsive.
- Foster collaboration through South-South and triangular partnerships.
- Amplify the role of students, educators, and researchers in advancing the 2030 Agenda.
- Launch formal engagement on the HESI Partnership Framework, supporting greater coordination and visibility for higher education's role in sustainable development.

Participants of the Networking Forum were encouraged to continue their engagement through this landmark event and to contribute to the shared mission of building a more just, sustainable, and knowledge-driven future.
