AT

THE THIRD UNITED NATIONS OCEAN CONFERENCE

10 JUNE 2025

Mr. President,

Excellencies,

Distinguished Delegates,

1. On behalf of the Indonesian Government...

➔ I would like to thank France and Costa Rica...for convening this Conference at a critical time.

- 2. Our ocean... is calling for our collective actions....
- 3. Warming seas... rising acidification... collapsing fisheries... and marine pollution...

➔ threaten our life.

4. Therefore, as the world's largest archipelagic State...

we reaffirm our **commitment** because...

→ ocean is part of our history...

→ our identity...

→ and our future.

5. Under the leadership of President Prabowo...

> ➔ we manage our ocean through blue economy as an important part of the Asta Cita vision...

> ➔ that is our Eight National Aspirations.

- 6. Allow me to convey *three key messages* from Indonesia.
- 7. **<u>FIRST</u>**, we reaffirm our commitment...

→ to the multilateral system...

➔ and to upholding international law.

8. The UNCLOS as the Constitution of the Ocean...

→ must serve as the guiding principle for all activities in the ocean.

9. We are also committed to the effective implementation

of relevant international agreements...

➔ including the Biodiversity
 Beyond National
 Jurisdiction Agreement...

➔ and to contribute to global efforts to combat IUU fishing, marine pollution, and plastic waste.

10.On this note, I am pleased to announce that...

➔ Indonesia has ratified the Agreement on Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction

➔ and has formally deposited its Instrument of Ratification today..

11.<u>SECOND</u>, Indonesia continues to lead by example...

 \rightarrow delivering tangible actions.

12.Our Blue Economy Policy is...

➔ aligned with the vision to advance the SDGs...

→ as it is based on the principles of ecological integrity, social equity, and inclusive economic growth.

- 13.We are implementing five priority programs of Blue Economy:
 - ➔ Expanding marine conservation areas to

cover 30% (*thirty percent*) of our waters by 2045 (*two thousand forty-five*)...

- Implementing quotabased, responsible fisheries...
- Promoting sustainable aquaculture...
- Strengthening ecosystem surveillance on coastal and small islands... and
- Engaging fishermen... and coastal communities in reducing marine plastic pollution.
- 14.Currently, Indonesia has protected over 29 (*twenty*-

nine) million hectares of marine areas...

15.Since 2020 (two thousand twenty)...

➔ we have rehabilitated mangroves...

➔ and reduced marine plastic debris.

16.With 3.44 (*three point forty-four*) million hectares of mangroves and 1.8 (*one point eight*) million hectares of seagrass...

→ we host as one of the largest blue carbon reserves in the world...

→ storing an estimated 17% (seventeen percent) of global blue carbon.

17.These coastal ecosystems serve as critical carbon sinks...

➔ and contribute to regulate the global climate...

➔ and ocean health.

18.Indonesia has also made significant strides in developing multi-hazard early warning systems....

➔ aligned with the UN's Early Warnings for All initiative.

19.Additionally, we are committed to develop more than 20,000 (*twenty thousand*) hectares of new aquaculture... ➔ using modern and sustainable technology...

➔ to boost productivity and ensure environmental sustainability...

20.Through our *Blue Food* initiative...

➔ we aim to increase domestic fish production...

→ to enhance food self-sufficiency...

➔ and create quality job opportunities for coastal communities.

21.Global cooperation and partnerships should also cover ...

➔ Blue Food, such as seaweed farming.

➔ In this regard, we support the idea to establish global seaweed task force...

→ that will create coordination between countries, markets, technologies and academics.

22.<u>THIRD</u>, Indonesia calls for stronger global cooperation...

> ➔ on capacity building, open science, marine research, marine spatial planning and technology transfer...

→ to accelerate progress towards SDG-14 (*fourteen*).
 23.We must also strengthen access to innovative and

inclusive source of financing...

➔ and Indonesia continues to develop innovative financing.

24.Together with the World Bank... we are finalizing the Indonesia Coral Reef Bond.
→ This is an innovative

funding instrument as...

➔ the world's first nonsovereign bond...

➔ and non-debt instrument for coral reef conservation.

25.During our G20 (*Ji-twenty*) Presidency...

➔ the Leaders Declaration acknowledged the Global Blended Finance Alliance, which we are implementing → and also, launched the Ocean 20 (*Twenty*) initiative with its Blue Halo S...

26.These efforts aim to close the financing gap for ocean, and coastal resilience...

→ with support from multiple countries and global institutions.

27.As part of our efforts to celebrate 2026 (*two thousand twenty-six*), World Ocean Day...

> ➔ Indonesia will host the "Ocean Impact Summit".

28.The Summit will bring global leaders, experts, policy makers, private sector, philanthropists...

> ➔ to strengthen partnership and focus on tangible impacts in areas of...

- ➔ Blue Food…
- ➔ Blue Diplomacy…
- → Blue Economy...
- → and Blue Energy.
