Data Challenges in Social Protection

High Costs and Timeliness Issues

- Limited resources hinder frequent data collection
- Household Survey Data (LCMS), 2010, 2015 and now 2022
- The national census, conducted every 10 years, limits monitoring of interventions (2010 and then 2022)



Data Challenges in Social Protection

Fragmented and Incomplete Information Systems

- Multiple siloed MIS systems and manual processes reduce coordination, create significant barriers to information sharing, efficiency, and targeting accuracy.
- ZISPIS is not fully operational, though it has been rolled out to 116 districts

Lack of Systems for Shock and Disaster Response Data

- Absence of effective data collection to identify and support affected populations during emergencies.
- During the drought, the Government had to create a whole new register to incorporate new beneficiaries.

2. Strengthen Monitoring and Evaluation

Improve systems to track interventions effectively

4. Continuous capacity building

Train stakeholders in data collection and management.
