

**2025 SDG Global Business Forum** Business in Action: Co-Creating Solutions for a Sustainable Future

Tuesday, 22 July 2025, 8:00 a.m.-09:30 a.m. (EDT), Virtual

## Background

Co-convened by United Nations Global Compact (UNGC), United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA), International Organisation of Employers (IOE) and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development (WBCSD), the SDG Global Business Forum (website is forthcoming) is the premier annual platform for showcasing how business are driving progress across the full breadth of sustainable development.

The 2025 SDG Global Business Forum will convene leaders from business, government, civil society, and other sectors to explore how to foster a more **conducive policy environment** to maximize the private sector's contributions to the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals. The Forum will also showcase **innovative**, **field-driven actions** that can inform and inspire future policy agendas.

The 2025 SDG Global Business Forum will be held as one of the high-level special events alongside the <u>2025 High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF)</u>, the United Nations' central platform for follow-up and review of the SDGs. This year's discussions will place particular emphasis on SDGs under in-depth review: Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-being); Goal 5 (Gender Equality); Goal 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth); Goal 14 (Life Below Water); and Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).

In alignment with the Pact for the Future (Action 55(c)[1]), which calls for strengthening private sector accountability and its contribution to addressing global challenges, this year's Forum will contribute to broader multilateral discussions on sustainable development. Building on the outcomes of the fourth International Conference on Financing for Development (30 June - 3 July 2025), which will tackle systemic financing barriers, the discussions of the 2025 SDG Global Business Forum will help inform key intergovernmental processes, including the Second World Summit for Social Development (4 - 6 November 2025). Nearly three decades after the first Social Summit, world leaders will reconvene to address persistent gaps in poverty eradication, decent work, and social inclusion - areas where business engagement is increasingly seen as essential.
