Preparatory Process for the 2026 UN Water Conference Delivered on July 9, 2025

Excellencies, colleagues and friends,

Water is not just a sector — it is a driver of peace, resilience, and sustainable development.

SIWI and ICWC congratulate the co-chairs and welcome the inclusive process behind the six proposed Interactive Dialogues. We are especially encouraged to see World Water Week recognized as a key platform and remain committed to strengthening it ahead of 2026. We urge that water's full systemic role be reflected across the Dialogues — particularly its connection to climate adaptation, food systems, urban resilience, and macroeconomic stability.

Informal dialogues, joint research and capacity development, can help foster trust and shared solutions. SIWI stands ready to support efforts that bridge divide and strengthen regional stability.

Inclusion Must Be Real, Not Symbolic
