A Decade of Learning, Training and Practice for the SDGs

For ten years, the SDGs in Practice series – held as a special event to the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) – has provided a dedicated space for applied knowledge–sharing, skills–building, and collaboration to advance the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The series has sought to equip policymakers, practitioners and various stakeholders with the knowledge and skills needed for SDG implementation.

A total of 106 training and learning sessions on SDG implementation have been convened by UN entities, governments, academia, civil society, and the private sector, reaching thousands of participants. Each year, the sessions have aligned with the HLPF themes and the SDGs under review, complementing the Forum's policy discussions and ensuring relevance to participants.

A collaborative approach to delivery

Over the decade, about **250 unique partner organizations** have collaborated in the design and delivery of the training sessions. The mix has been genuinely multistakeholder, spanning governments, UN system entities, civil society, academia, and the private sector.

Together, these partners embody the spirit of SDG 17 in action—bringing complementary perspectives, expertise, and capacities to a common platform for shared learning.

Lessons learned

Over the past decade, SDGs in Practice has evolved from a foundational learning space into a practice-oriented platform that has equipped policymakers, practitioners, and stakeholders with the knowledge and handson skills needed to advance the implementation of the SDGs.

Drawing on ten years of experience, the following section provides an overview of key lessons learned from the series and how they have shaped its approach to capacity-building, knowledge-sharing, and action-oriented learning.



Alignment with HLPF themes and SDGs in focus

Ensuring that sessions were linked to the HLPF's overarching theme and the SDGs under in-depth review has proved crucial in attracting balanced participation from government representatives, civil society actors, and other stakeholders. This alignment has created a strong policy connection and has positioned the series as a practical complement to the intergovernmental policy discussions taking place at HLPF.



Session design and inclusivity

Sessions that were structured as a progression from challenge to tool to practice have consistently had a positive impact. Demonstrating a specific tool or practice in action and complementing it with a real-world example has strengthened participants' ability to replicate approaches in their own contexts.

The inclusion of short, interactive exercises – such as live polling or breakout–room discussions – has proved highly effective in translating theoretical knowledge into concrete action steps, ensuring that participants were instilled with skills they could immediately apply.

Efforts to achieve balance across gender, geographical representation, and stakeholder diversity – including organizations of persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples, and women's groups – have significantly improved the quality and depth of dialogue and outcomes.

Partnerships, data and evidence

One of the insights that has stood out is that multi-stakeholder collaboration needs to be treated not as an ad hoc activity but as an integral part of institutional practice and a core professional competency. Effective partnerships have been those built on clearly defined roles, strong facilitation, transparent predictable governance structures, and financing tailored mechanisms collaborative work. Treating partnership facilitation as an investable function - rather than relying solely on project-based funding - has enabled longer-term engagement and more sustainable outcomes.

Another key lesson has been that integrating sources-administrative. data diverse geospatial, and citizen-generated - into policy cycles can deliver actionable insights. Demonstrations and case examples have shown that when these data ecosystems feed into Voluntary National Reviews, UN Development Cooperation Sustainable Frameworks, and national development they strengthen evidence-based plans, policymaking.

Evolving modality

Adopting а blended approach that combined virtual and in-person sessions has proved effective in expanding participation from developing countries and marginalized groups. Originally introduced in response to the constraints of the COVID-19 pandemic, the virtual format has since been maintained as a valuable tool to extend global reach and enhance accessibility. At the same time, strategically selected in-person sessions have continued to provide the convening power necessary for dialogue, as well as for building partnerships, trust, and ownership.

SDGs in Practice Learning Library

To mark the decade milestone, the **SDGs in Practice Learning Library** is being launched as a new resource.

The library brings together the full record of sessions over the past decade into one accessible platform. It is designed as a practical tool for policymakers, practitioners, and educators seeking tested approaches to accelerate SDG implementation.

The library extends the reach of the series beyond HLPF, ensuring that the lessons, tools, and methods developed through collaboration with hundreds of partners remain accessible and actionable in the years leading to 2030.
