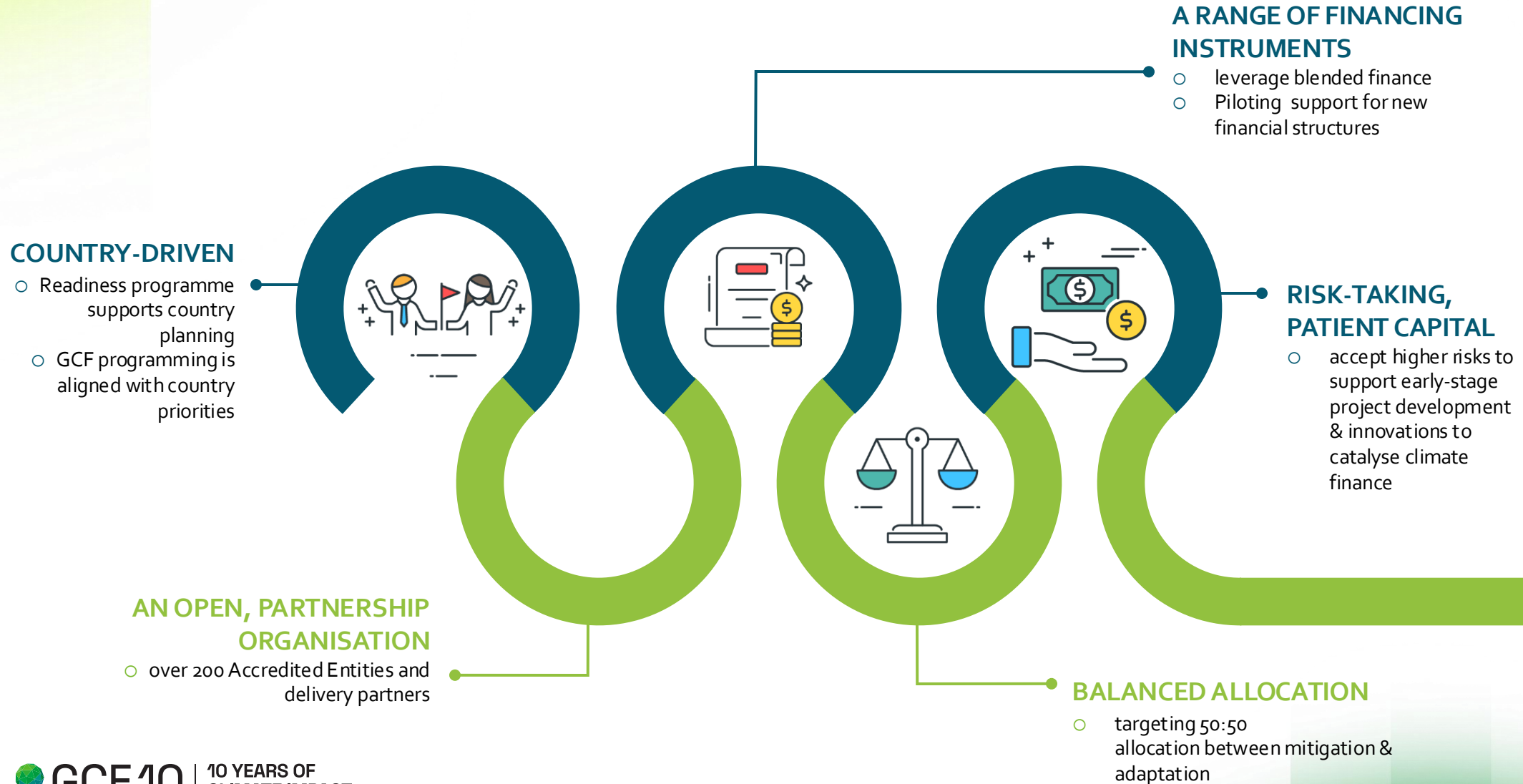

We are now committing to complete our reviews of Concept Notes and Funding Proposals in nine months or less.

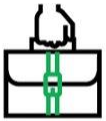


Programming Priorities 2024-2027

Integrated Results Management Framework

Summary

This document presents GCF's integrated results management framework (IRMF), which is intended to merge the initial results management framework (decision B.07/04) and performance measurement frameworks (decision B.08/07) into one framework, the IRMF. The IRMF updates GCF's results architecture and related measurement and reporting approaches for the first replenishment period of the GCF.

The IRMF also seeks to further strengthen the ability of GCF to measure and report the impact of its investments by updating GCF's results architecture to operate in improved alignment with the GCF Investment Framework, and enabling more consistent measurement and reporting of results from the project/programme level. This proposed results architecture is designed to measure both quantifiable impacts of GCF investments, as well as the GCF contribution to the paradigm shift towards low-emission and climate-resilient development pathways in the context of sustainable development. Additionally, it also further supports the implementation of the objectives of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Paris Agreement, as set out in the Governing Instrument for the GCF and the initial Strategic Plan as well as the updated Strategic Plan of the GCF 2020–2023 (decision B.27/06).

This document also presents the GCF results tracking tool linked with the updated Strategic Plan, which is intended to enable integrated reporting of progress towards the delivery of the updated Strategic Plan.

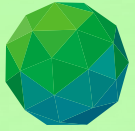

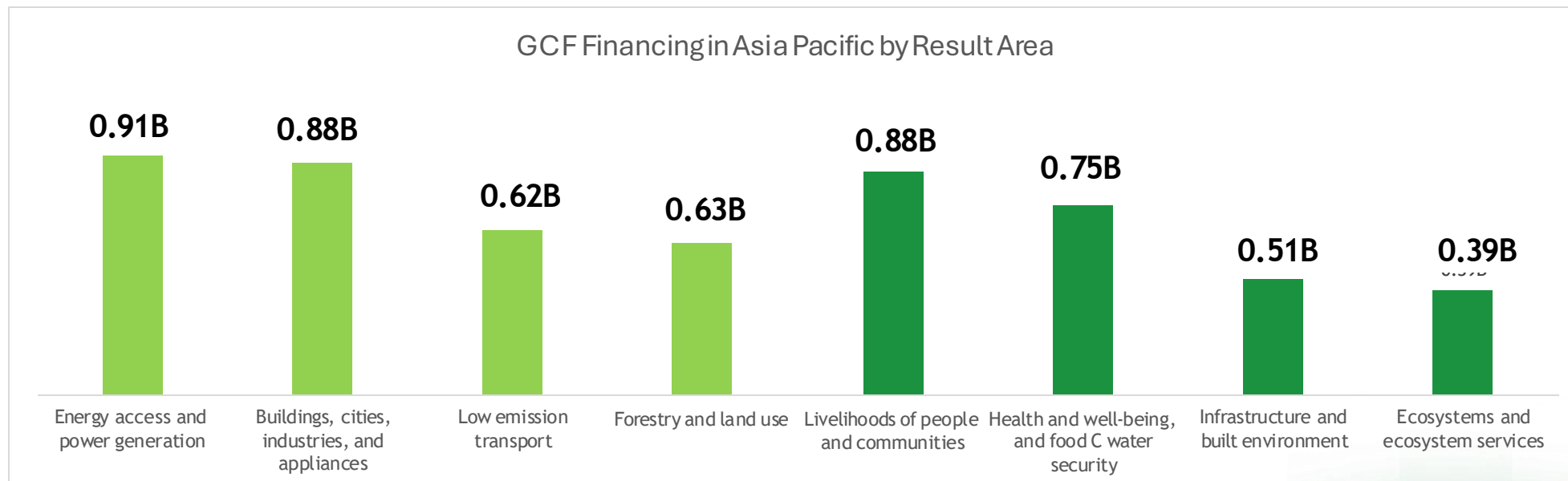
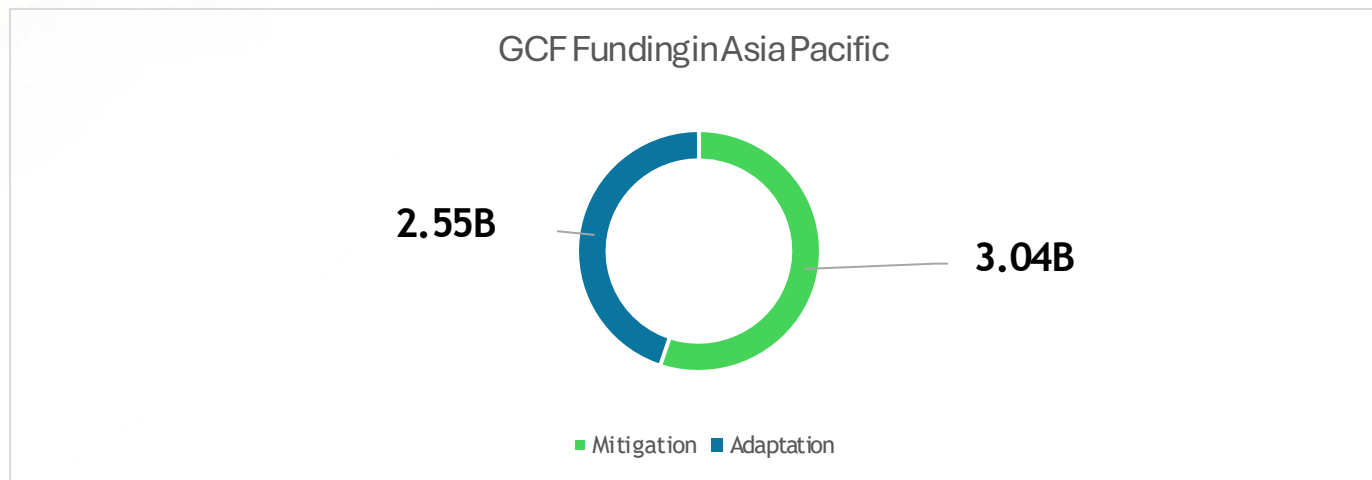

GCF Portfolio in Asia Pacific Region

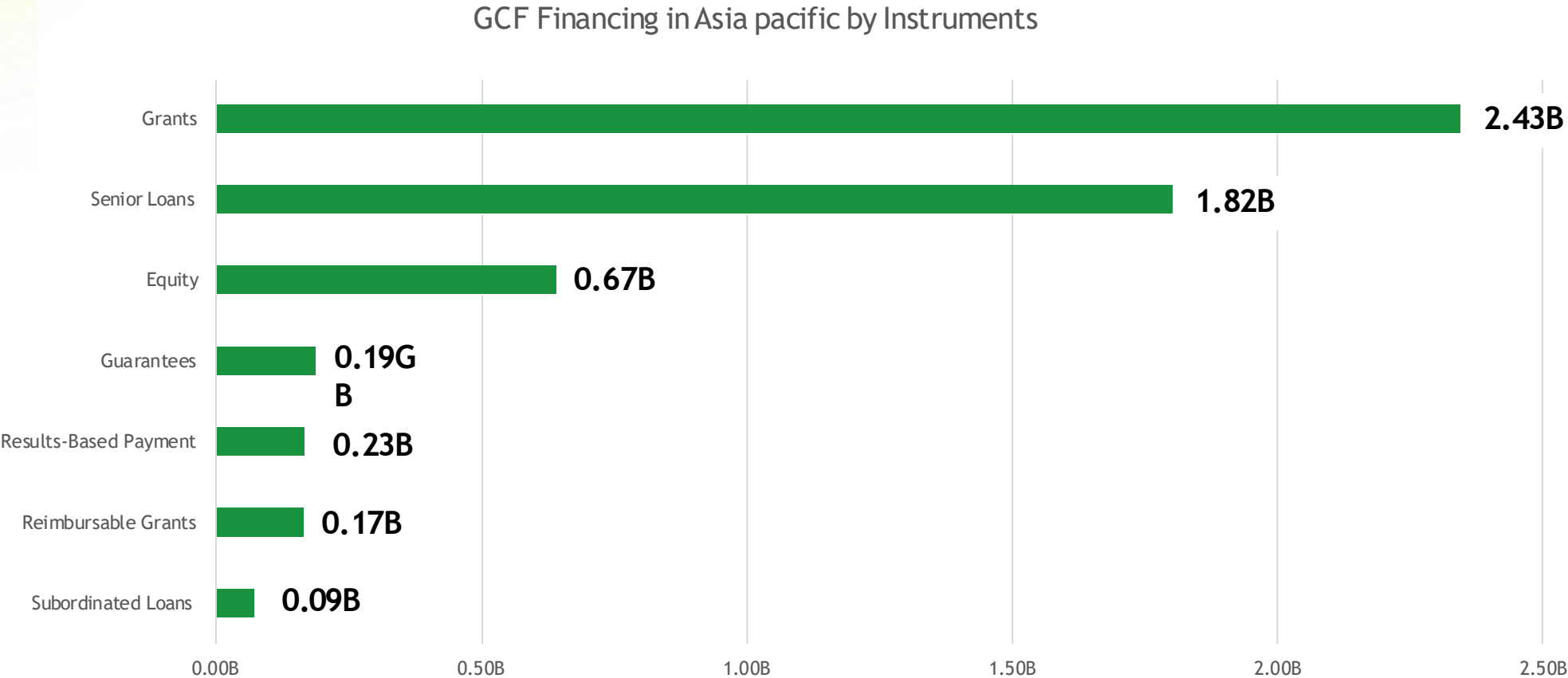

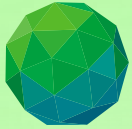

Project to **reduce climate vulnerability, lower health risks and increase socioeconomic development for vulnerable communities by improving food and water security, enhancing disaster risk reduction and recovery, and building local adaptive capacity** to respond to climate change. This will be achieved by building the capacity of local authorities to deliver climate change adaptation services by enhancing their technical expertise.

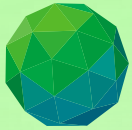

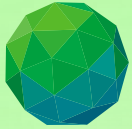

By raising plinths above flood levels, promoting flood-tolerant livelihoods, and ensuring access to safe drinking water and sanitation, the project empowered thousands of vulnerable households to reclaim their dignity and security. Women, once disproportionately burdened by climate impacts, emerged as leaders in strengthening community resilience.

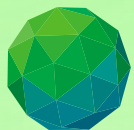

Challenges

- **Operational challenges:** includes logistics and site accessibility given the remote nature of some countries we work in.
- **Financial challenges:** post-Covid cost escalation, currency fluctuations, and challenges in securing co-finance.
- **Socio-Political and Economic Challenges:** broader political changes and periods of instability.
- **Procurement challenges:** particularly in SIDS and remote contexts
- **Human resources challenges:** challenges in securing technical capacity in critical roles, particularly in smaller population settings
- **Monitoring and reporting / data quality:** data gaps and methodological variations

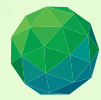
