Mr. President,

Distinguished Delegates,

Brazil thanks the ECOSOC for convening the Partnership Forum, an essential space to deepen dialogue on the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

For Brazil, partnerships are central tools for turning global commitments into tangible results.

Given the complexity of today's challenges, multisectoral cooperation is indispensable to accelerate sustainable development and to ensure that no one is left behind.

The Goals under review this year, SDGs 6, 7, 9, 11, and 17, underscore the need for integrated approaches.

In Brazil, we have prioritized areas such as universal access to water and sanitation, a just energy transition, the strengthening of sustainable infrastructure, innovation, and inclusive urban development, recognizing that progress in these areas depends on strong and lasting partnerships.

In this context, SDG 17 plays a cross-cutting role.

Mr. President,

In 2023, Brazil reestablished its National Commission for the Sustainable Development Goals, ensuring equal representation from government and civil society. This has reinforced interinstitutional coordination, engagement with multiple stakeholders, and evidence-based monitoring of the SDGs.

Brazil has also advanced in localizing the 2030 Agenda by mobilizing subnational governments and integrating the Goals into local public policies, thereby expanding implementation at the territorial level.

In this spirit, Brazil is preparing its 2026 Voluntary National Review, under the coordination of the National Commission for the SDGs.

This participatory and multisectoral exercise brings together contributions from government, the private sector, civil society, subnational governments, and academia alike.

The process aims to provide a comprehensive, evidence-based assessment of the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

Alongside the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, it incorporates Brazil's SDG 18, a national initiative dedicated to promoting ethnic and racial equality within Brazilian society.

Brazil reaffirms its commitment to cooperate with international partners and to contribute actively to the work of ECOSOC and the High-Level Political Forum, with the aim of accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.
