Endorse effective models of resilient urban water management, in line with the Habitat 3 New Urban Agenda, which embrace a basin-wide perspective (including transboundary) and integrated planning of urban development, green and gray water infrastructure. 2. Encourage upstream investments that, through supporting system-scale early planning, provide support to countries in identifying complimentary “grey” and “green” water infrastructure programs. These will provide cost-effective and sustainable investments that will also balance development objectives with environmental and social priorities.

Scenario roadmap	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Consider the set of principles (see detailed note) at the Sherpas’ meeting in Budapest. Deadline: <u>November 29</u>. 2. Based on the principles the Panel finds fit, the action on challenges (championed by Australia) can include a challenge on effective models of resilient urban water management. (Different categories could be envisaged.) Deadline: The challenge can be prepared before the Davos meeting of the Panel and <u>launched in Davos</u>. 3. The Panel can endorse effective models (as set in Action 1, Chapter Sustainable Cities) as a result of the challenge and as a way of encouraging on-going successful solutions. Deadline: to be <u>set at the time of launching the challenge</u>.
