We are pleased to write to you in our capacity as co-facilitators appointed by the President of the General Assembly to oversee the preparatory process and to conclude the intergovernmental consultations on a "Call for Action" for the United Nations Conference to Support the Implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 14: Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development.

The General Assembly, in resolution 70/303, requested the President of the General Assembly to convene a two-day preparatory meeting, in February 2017, at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, to be chaired by the two co-facilitators, with a view to considering the themes for the partnership dialogues and elements for a "Call for Action". The President of the General Assembly in his letter dated 3 November 2016 conveyed his decision to convene the preparatory meeting on 15 and 16 February 2017.

Resolution 70/303 also requested that the co-facilitators present the draft "Call for Action" no later than March 2017, and states that intergovernmental consultations on a "Call for Action" are to be concluded by May 2017.

In preparation for the two-day preparatory meeting and intergovernmental consultations on a "Call for Action", we would like to invite you to attend an informal briefing on Wednesday, 01 February 2017 from 11.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. in conference room 3. At the informal briefing, the Secretary-General's background note for the preparatory meeting as well as a tentative programme of work for the preparatory meeting will be presented. The tentative programme of work for the preparatory meeting is attached to the present letter.
