## Rio+20 policy decisions on sustainable cities and urban transport

The United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development, known as “Rio+20”, was held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, 13-22 June 2012. More than 100 State and Government Heads attended the conference, and more than 50,000 participants took part in one or more of the many associated events. Rio+20 adopted by consensus a comprehensive outcome document-“The future we want”, which was subsequently endorsed by the United Nations General Assembly. Rio+20 noted that transportation and mobility are central to sustainable development, and recognized the importance of the efficient movement of people and goods, and access to environmentally sound, safe and affordable transportation as a means to improve social equity, health, resilience of cities, urban-rural linkages and productivity of rural areas. Rio+20 called upon governments to support the development of sustainable transport systems, including energy efficient multi-modal transport systems, notably public mass transportation systems, clean fuels and vehicles.

## Objectives of the Rio+20 Follow-up High-level Dialogue



Coinciding with the first anniversary of Rio+20, Berlin High-level Dialogue on Implementing Rio+20 Decisions on Sustainable Cities and Urban Transport aim to (a) highlight proven sustainable urban planning and transport policies and measures, (b) identify good and best practices in this regard, and (c) facilitate capacity building through national and international exchanges of information and experiences among relevant practitioners, experts and policy makers, in particular from developing countries.

## Berlin: A future capital city of sustainability

The Government of the State of Berlin recently adopted a coalition agreement for the period 2011-2016 to make Berlin a future “Capital of Sustainability”. The local government is committed to (a) scale up the use of renewable energy (incl. through energy storage and smarter grids), (b) improve energy conservation in retrofitted and “greener” buildings, (c) re-develop and modernize urban “brownfields”, (d) establish clean technology business parks, (e) invest in infrastructure and public transport services, and to facilitate the use of car and bike sharing systems, with a view to attain the following milestones and goals, (f) by 2020, 10 per cent of vehicles to be electric (incl. electric bikes), (g) by 2030, 60 per cent of local electricity (2500 MW) to come from renewable sources, (h) by 2050, to become a carbon-neutral “Capital of Sustainability”.
