"One-stop shop"


- Minimum age and medical certification

- Accommodation and recreational facilities
- Food and catering
- Health, safety and accident prevention
- Onboard medical care
- Onboard compliant procedures
- Payment of wages

"This Convention applies to all fishers and all fishing vessels engaged in commercial fishing operations."
