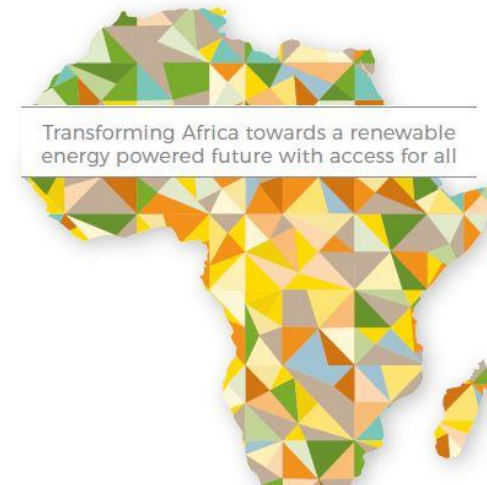

Africa Renewable Energy Initiative (AREI)

- **Africa-owned** and led initiative launched at COP21 to harness the continent's renewable energy potential
- Endorsed by African Heads of State and Government on Climate Change (**CAHOSCC**).
- Aims to achieve at least **10 GW** of new and additional renewable energy generation capacity by 2020, and mobilize the African potential to generate at least **300 GW** by 2030.
- **19 projects** have been approved by the AREI board and are being implemented. More projects are currently being reviewed.

IMPLEMENTATION PHASES

The immediate establishment phase (2016-2017): Formal initiation of the AREI activities, including resource mobilisation, establishment of the governance and management structure and identification of initial Phase I programmes and projects.

Phase I (2017-2020): In cooperation with bilateral and global partners, assessments, preparations and critical enabling activities at the continental African level as well as in a number of pioneering countries. Achievement of at least 10 GW new and additional generation capacity.

Phase II (2020-2030): Ambitious, full-scale roll-out of nationally determined policies, programmes and incentives as initiated under Phase I. Continuous project identifications, assessments and revisions for further scaling up to at least 300 GW new and additional generation capacity of renewable energy.

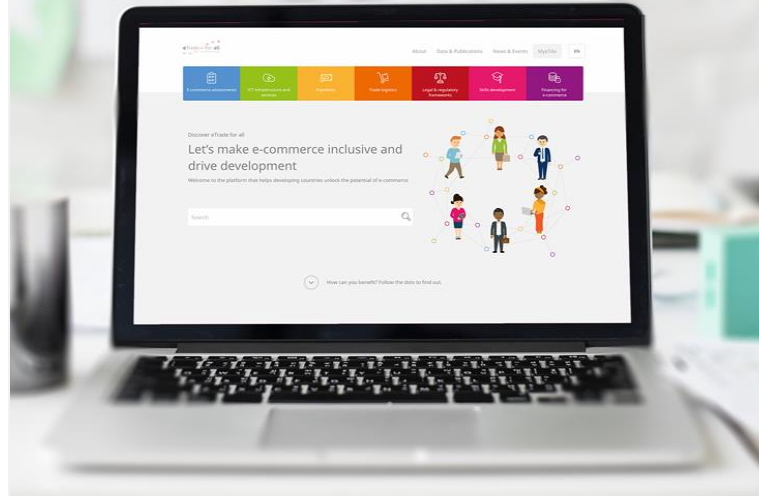
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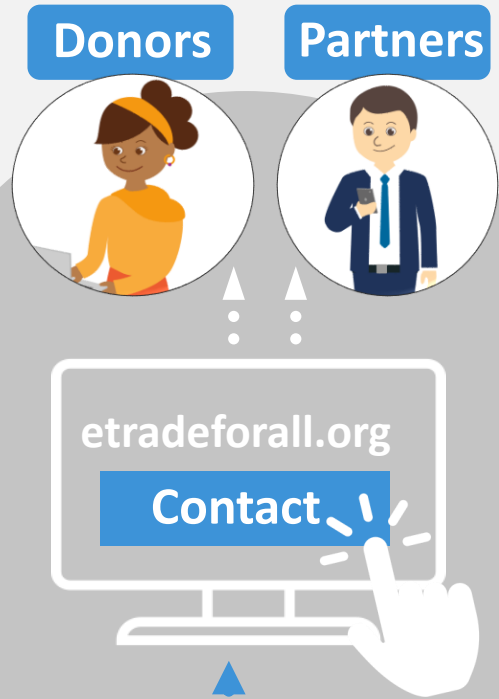

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Name of the partnership: Safer Cities for Girls Programme

SDGs and Targets being addressed:

SDG 11, Targets 11.1/2/3/5/7; and contributing to SDG 5 and SDG 16

Partners and beneficiaries:

A joint programme developed in partnership between Plan International, Women in Cities International (WICI), and UN-HABITAT to build safe, accountable, and inclusive cities with and for adolescent girls. The programme is being carried out in ten cities around the world: Cairo, Alexandria, Assiut, Egypt; Delhi, India; Hanoi, Vietnam; Kampala, Uganda; Lima, Peru; Nairobi, Kenya; Asuncion, Paraguay; and Honiara, Solomon Islands.

Value added to SDGs implementation:

The overarching goal of the programme is to build safe, accountable, and inclusive cities with and for adolescent girls in all their diversity. Since the start of the programme in 2014, it has promoted collective action around the need for safer cities, raised awareness on the issue of girls' safety in cities, and strengthened collaboration with local authorities on safer cities. Additionally, the programme has promoted gender equality and girls' rights through social norm change, created an enabling environment for girls and boys, challenged gender stereotypes and discriminatory behavior, and encouraged support from duty bearer like police, city councilors, local transport associations. Overall, the programme has (a) improved adolescent girls' safety and access to public spaces; (b) their active and meaningful participation in urban devt and governance; (c) their autonomous and safe mobility in the city.
