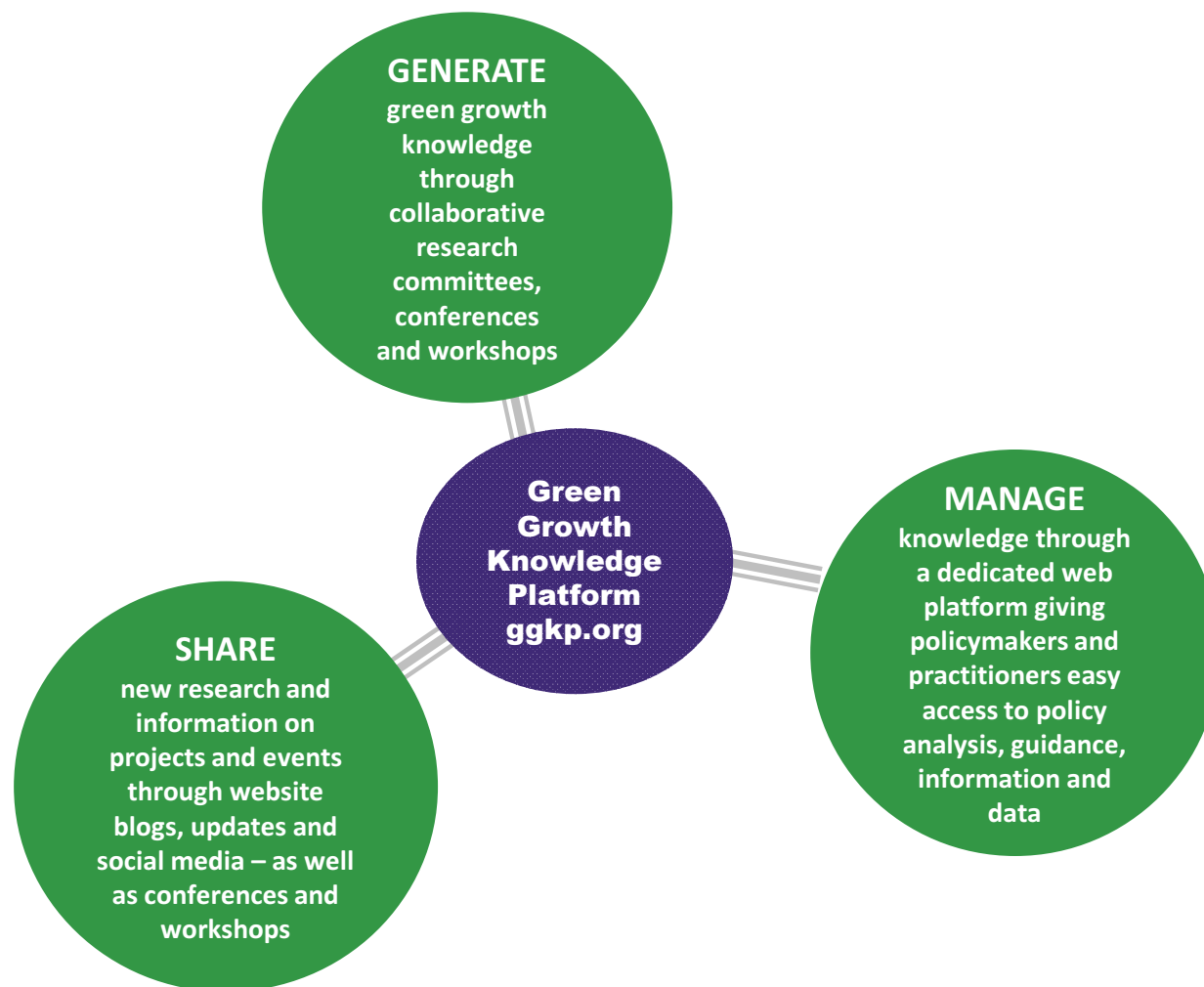




The GGKP's first joint publication was launched by the OECD, World Bank, UNEP and GGGI at the GGKP Annual Conference in April 2013.
