Like the true meaning of Ocean, I hope that this meeting will deepen the embracing and understanding among all ocean stakeholders, expanding the potential for cooperation.

I think that embracing and understanding are core values of the sustainable development. To facilitate mutual understanding and cooperation among the COAs, the City of Incheon will also play an active role.

Also, Incheon will work more actively to realize its vision toward an ecologically sustainable marine city. We will join the international community’s efforts in pursuing a sustainable marine environment through active environment protection and conservation of the oceans and wetlands, and creating a marine-friendly urban environment.
